- Non-slip flooring across all high-traffic areas
- Smooth transitions between rooms without raised edges
- Motion-sensor lighting in hallways and bathrooms
- Adjustable lighting levels to suit different times of day



Adapted Bathrooms and Kitchens

Bathrooms and kitchens are high-use areas where <u>accessibility</u> can't be compromised. Look out for these features:

- Walk-in showers with handheld showerheads
- Grab bars beside toilets and inside showers
- Lever-style faucets and comfort-height fixtures
- Pull-out shelves and lower storage cabinets for easy reach

As vision and fine motor skills decrease, smart layouts improve quality of life. Look out for these features:

- Wide doorways and open layouts
- Smart lighting and temperature controls
- Emergency alert and intercom systems
- Space to install handrails or assistive devices
